


Preserving a CdM Treasure at 309 Poppy Avenue

Mr. Jacobs shared with me the spectacular ocean view from the rooftop deck of his lovely home. He has been the architect of these and many other CdM projects. In fact, he has completed projects in Ukraine, China and Pakistan and is currently working on a tasting room in Shenandoah Valley in Amador County!

After hearing all these amazing stories of projects and travel, I asked Mr. Jacobs about his career as an architect and love for architecture. He explained that growing up in rural Indiana, he had never really seen tall architectural buildings until he went to Arizona as a high school student and that was


when he knew he wanted to become an architect. Lucky for him and us!

Being a one-time volunteer firefighter in his life, he feels as though it is always necessary to help your community for the better. As if that wasn't enough, Mr. Jacobs is also on the board for fundraising for our very own lovely CdM Sherman Gardens.

When Mr. Jacobs is not preserving homes, building shelters, traveling and generally giving to his community, he recharges by grabbing a cappuccino and walking Charlotte, his sweet King Charles Cavalier
